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1 March 15, 2018 11:37 a.m. 2 PROCEEDINGS 3 MATTHEW RICHARDS, called as a witness herein, having been first duly 4 5 sworn by the Certified Court Reporter to tell the 6 truth, was examined and testified as follows: 7 **EXAMINATION** 8 BY MR. 9 Q. Would you please state your name for the record, please, sir. 10 Matthew Kent Richards. 11 Α. 12 Mr. Richards, how are you employed? Q. 13 I'm an attorney. Α. 14 With Kirton McConkie; right? Q. 15 Α. Correct. Have you been employed by any other law 16 Q. 17 firm during the course of your career as an attorney? 18 Α. No. 19 And you've been employed by Kirton McConkie Q. since approximately what year? 20 Α. 1998. 21 22 And what is the nature of your practice as of today? What kind of law do you practice? 23 It's an outside general counsel role. 24 Α. client is the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day

1 Saints and its affiliated legal entities. Do you have any clients other than the 2 3 Church and its affiliated legal entities? I occasionally work on other matters. Α. 4 5 And then would I be correct to conclude Q. 6 that as general counsel, you provide advice to your 7 clients on a number of different types of matters? Α. Yes. 8 9 However, does that advice tend to focus on certain matters other than others, like tax versus 10 constitutional issues versus real estate and that sort 11 12 of thing? 13 I have a geographic boundary of the United Α. States and Canada. And then other than that, I have 14 certain areas where I am a point of contact for, but I 15 16 can be called upon to render any number of services. 17 Ο. Does that include tax matters? 18 Α. I do get tax questions and refer them to 19 experts. 20 Q. Okay. 21 So you wouldn't be the person to render that advice directly, in other words? 22 I sometimes am involved in the advice. 23 Α.

And I'm trying to get a good sense of what

type of matters you generally would be the person to

provide advice to the Church.

Can you illuminate me on that in any more specifics or do I need to just start listing different types of areas of the law?

- A. I enlist experts in any area that I'm asked to, because I'm in some ways that's the nature of a general counsel kind of role, right? You get lots of questions. They may be covering a range of topics. My job is to make sure that the client gets useful information back.
- Q. As a general practice, when calls are made to the helpline, are you a person that routinely is involved in responding to those calls?
 - A. No.
- Q. Are you a lifelong resident of the Salt Lake City area?
 - A. No.
- Q. Then just give me a brief background of what you would consider perhaps where you grew up, where you went to college, law school, that sort of thing, just so I can get a little background.
- A. I was born here and have lived in Utah most of my life, but I had two years abroad, in another country.

Has that been the Salt Lake 3 or greater Salt Lake area or other parts of the state that you would not consider part of the Salt Lake area? 4 5 Α. It also included some time in Provo, Utah. 6 Q. And are you a lifelong member of Church of 7 Latter-Day Saints? 8 Α. The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day 9 Saints? Yes. Thank you. And I'm sorry if I misspoke. 10 Q. don't mean to be offensive by that. 11 12 Do you currently hold any leadership 13 positions within the Church? 14 Α. No. 15 Ο. Have you in the past? 16 Α. Yes. 17 Q. What roles have you had? 18 Α. I have served as a bishop. 19 Over what ward was that? Q. 20 In my local neighborhood. Α. Is there a name for that ward? 21 Q. 22 The Ward. Α. 23 Q. What year was that, or years? 2013 to 2018. 24 Α. Are you still a bishop? 25 Q.

I don't think I would characterize it as a progression, but it is true that upon the age of 18, 24 they may become an elder. 25

And then back to my -- help me understand, 1 2 as part of the elders quorum, what was your role or 3 function? I oversaw the teaching -- as part of the Α. 5 leadership of the elders quorum, I oversaw the teaching 6 and the instruction in Sunday meetings. Elders are 7 invited to visit each other on a periodic basis, and I was -- helped to coordinate those assignments and 8 follow up to see how those -- the members of the quorum 9 and their families were doing. 10 11 Q. You also mentioned that you served as a high councilor; right? 12 13 Α. Correct. 14 High councilor to whom? **Q**. 15 Α. To a stake president. 16 And as a high councilor to a stake Q. 17 president, what was your function? What did you do? 18 Α. I had different assignments that varied from time to time. 19 During what years did you serve as a high 20 Q. councilor? 21 22 I don't recall. Α. 23 Q. Has it been within the last five years? 24 No. Α.

And what were some of the assignments that

1 you were given as high councilor? 2 I helped support the Sunday school teachers 3 and leaders in the stake. I was -- my particular assignment for part of my time was to help support a 5 branch of the Church at a hospital for children. And 6 so I helped that very small branch minister to patients and their families in the hospital. Are there any other callings in which you 8 Q. 9 serve in the Church that you can recall as we sit here 10 now? 11 Α. I don't recall any others. 12 Q. When did you first become aware that there had been a call made to the helpline concerning 13 14 In August of 2015. 15 Α. 16 Q. And how was it you became aware of that? 17 Α. I was informed by Randall Kent. 18 Q. And what was the means of that 19 communication? Email? Telephone call? How did that happen? 20 I know that there was an email. 21 I don't 22 recall whether there was also a phone call. 23 Q. And did you respond to him, offer some help, guidance or advice in response to his 24 communication to you? 25

1 Α. I did. 2 I take it you would refrain from telling me Q. 3 what that was due to attorney-client privilege? Correct. Α. 5 Do you know what action, if any, Mr. Kent 6 took after receiving the communication from you that 7 you gave to him in response to his initial email about 8 9 One of us, and I can't recall who, enlisted Α. the Church security department. 10 So you don't recall which of the two of you 11 Q. 12 actually would have contacted the Church security 13 department? I don't. 14 Α. 15 Do you know how that contact to the Church 16 security department would have been initiated? 17 email, telephone call. 18 Α. Either email or phone call. 19 And do you recall to whom in the Church Q. security department that initial communication was 20 21 made? 22 John Hodson. And once that contact was made with John 23 Ο. Hodson, do you know what the Church security department 24 did once it received that information?

1 Α. Yes. 2 Without getting into attorney-client Q. 3 privilege again, what action did they take in response to that communication from you or Mr. Kent? 4 5 MR. I object to the extent that you 6 would have to reveal attorney-client communications and 7 information. I don't know if you can answer otherwise. THE WITNESS: I am -- all I know about the 8 9 actions they took were what they told me. BY MR. 10 Would you -- can you confirm for me at 11 Q. least that it was your understanding they undertook 12 some sort of investigation? 13 14 I have the same request, that you not disclose anything that would be protected by 15 16 attorney-client privilege. 17 THE WITNESS: I think I need to follow my 18 counsel's direction. Everything I know about what they did was as a result of their communications to me. 19 happy to talk about the general process if that's where 20 21 you want to go. 22 BY MR. 23 Q. Then, yes, please, generally. And when you say the general process, give me if I -- when you say 24 25 the general process, the general process as regarding

what? Response to helpline 1 2 Response to helpline that might 3 involve the Church security department. What is, then, the general process, once Q. 4 5 you communicate to the Church security department 6 whatever the issue or problem might be? 7 That they would undertake an investigation. And then once they conduct their 8 Q. 9 investigation, the Church security department would report back to you or to someone in the law firm? 10 Α. 11 Yes. Do you know whether they would also report 12 Q. the findings of their investigation to any other person 13 or entity? 14 15 Α. Yes, I know. 16 Q. To whom would they report that, other than 17 you or someone in the Kirton McConkie law firm? 18 Α. That would be reported to me or someone in my firm. 19 No one else, however, you're saying? 20 Α. I'm not aware of every circumstance. 21 don't know. 22 23 Q. As a general practice, once the Church security department conducts an investigation, other 24 than reporting back to your law firm, you don't know 25

who else they would, in a matter of course, also report the findings of that investigation to?

A. I don't know.

- Q. In the normal course, at what point, if at all, does general counsel, the Office of General Counsel for the Church, become involved?
- A. If the Church security department and the general and the practice, if they determine, based on their investigation, that further action is recommended, that they recommend taking further action, then they report that to my firm. And then I or someone would inform the Office of General Counsel of the recommendation.
- Q. In your role as providing general counsel services to the Church, are you considered part of the Office of General Counsel?
 - A. No.
- Q. So they actually have lawyers that are full-time employees of the Church that serve in the Office of General Counsel?
 - A. Yes.
- Q. If the Church security department determines that further action may need to be taken, as you've described it, which then general counsel would become involved, who initiates that contact with the

(Whereupon the record was read by the 4 5 reporter as follows: 6 QUESTION: Are you willing to state in this 7 particular circumstance involving who initiated contact with the Office of General Counsel?) 8 9 THE WITNESS: I did. BY MR. 10 And who is the specific person in the 11 12 Office of General Counsel that you initiated contact with concerning 13 14 Boyd Black. Α. 15 Q. And Boyd Black I take it, then, is an 16 attorney? 17 Α. He is. 18 Q. Is Boyd Black an attorney in the Office of General Counsel that routinely handles matters that 19 lead to PNG letters? 20 Can you give me the timeframe? 21 Α. 22 June through December 2015. Q. 23 Α. only attorney in the office that might be involved in 2 those but one of them? 3 Α. Correct. As a general matter, once these sorts of 4 5 situations are referred to the Office of General 6 Counsel, what role do you play after that? 7 We follow the instructions of the Church. Α. And that would be instructions that you 8 Q. would receive back from the Office of General Counsel? 9 Α. 10 Yes. Do you know what action, if any, the Office 11 Q. 12 of General Counsel took in response to you referring 13 matter to them? the 14 Yes. Α. 15 Are you able to tell me that, or would that 16 be something covered by attorney-client privilege as we 17 sit here today? 18 I would object and tell you not to answer to the extent it reveals attorney-client 19 20 communications. I would assume that would, but you would know. 21 22 THE WITNESS: I cannot answer that without 23 revealing privilege. 24 BY MR. 25 Q. Do you know what action they took?

Not by email or telephone, or any other manner for that matter? 18 19 I did not communicate with him. Α. 20 Do you know if Bishop was told of what investigation or other action had been taken by 21 22 the Church in response to his helpline inquiry? 23 Α. No. 24 So if anyone communicated with Bishop Q. about his complaint, you don't know if anybody did or 25

2 My answer to your question was that I do 3 not know what he was told. Do you know whether he was communicated Q. 5 with at all in response to his helpline inquiry once the Church security department became involved and it 6 7 was referred to the Office of General Counsel? Α. Yes. 8 Do you know who communicated with him? 9 Q. Α. I don't recall. 10 Was it someone with the Kirton McConkie law 11 Q. 12 firm? 13 I don't recall. 14 Do you know if anyone from the Church 15 security department communicated with him once the 16 Office of General Counsel reviewed the matter? 17 I don't believe the Office of General 18 Counsel -- I take issue with your question, because it assumes that the Office of General Counsel was involved 19 20 at that time period. 21 MR. I think he asked you about 22 Church security. 23 Wasn't your question Church security? 24 I think I asked that first MR. and then I asked about Office of General Counsel, I 25

Well, now you're into the 15 16 specifics of the process in this matter, which I object 17 to on the grounds of privilege. I think the general 18 process is fair, but the specific process is 19 privileged. 20 BY MR. Do you know, in the October timeframe, when 21 Bishop contacted the Kirton McConkie law firm 22 23 again, whether he also communicated with the Church security department at that timeframe? 24 25 Α. The Church security department conducted an

1 investigation. I don't believe I can comment further. 2 So in terms of the --Q. 3 MR. Hold on a second. (Discussion off the record.) 4 5 BY MR. 6 Q. In terms of actions that the Church 7 security department undertook in the course of its investigation, you're not willing to disclose what 8 action they undertook in their investigation because of 9 attorney-client privilege? 10 That's correct. 11 Α. 12 Are you aware of what action they undertook Q. 13 in the course of their investigation? 14 I'm aware of at least part of what they Α. did. 15 16 Q. And once they completed their 17 investigations, did they report back to you? 18 Α. Yes. 19 How long did it take them to conduct their Q. investigation once contact was received from Bishop 20 in October? 21 22 I don't recall. Α. 23 Q. What about the August timeframe, how long 24 did it take them to conduct their investigation at that 25 time?

1 Α. I don't recall. 2 Once the Church security department Q. 3 reported back to you in October, what action, if any, did you take in response to their report back about the 4 5 investigation? 6 MR. I object on the grounds of -- I 7 object to the extent it would call for you to reveal attorney-client privileged communications. So for 8 example, if you -- whatever communications you had, if 9 they were with the Church, would be -- you could not 10 reveal those. 11 12 THE WITNESS: I can't comment then. 13 BY MR. 14 So you're asserting attorney-client **Q**. privilege to answer that question? 15 16 Α. - Q. And that corporation is who owns the real estate on which meetinghouses are located?
 - A. Correct.
- Q. Are then local clergy, such as bishops, agents of that corporation?
 - A. They're responsible for the use and care of the meetinghouse.
 - Q. You heard Mr. Kent's testimony about the authority of a local bishop to control access to Church property; right?
 - A. I don't know that I recall that part of his testimony.
 - Q. Then let me ask you generally.

What would you understand the authority of a local bishop to be to restrict persons from coming on Church property, specifically a local meetinghouse

1 where a ward meets? 2 Local clergy have the ability to -- they 3 have a charge to maintain the atmosphere and the decorum and what goes on on the property. But if they 5 want to do something in a formal way, such as a persona 6 non grata letter, then it needs to be done through the 7 process that we've discussed previously. 8 Q. In a particular incidence, would a local clergyman have the right to order a person to leave 9 property without receiving permission or approval from 10 someone above him to do that? 11 12 Α. Yes, especially in an emergency. 13 So you've had an opportunity, Mr. Richards, Q. to examine Exhibit 2, which is "Defendant Matthew K. 14 Richards' Supplemental Answers to Plaintiff's 15 16 Discovery"? 17 Α. That's not what I was handed. 18 Q. I'm sorry. What were you handed? 19 I was handed Defendant Randall Kent's Α. supplemental answers. 20 My apologies. 21 Q. Oh.
